Millennium Green

What a pleasure it is to spend time in the Green, it has given me a definite Spring in my step.

The daffodils and crocus' although now over, gave us all a wonderful display.

This year Spring came early in February /March, bringing on the cherry blossom and new shoots on the trees. Unfortunately the warm spell did not last very long and the Oak trees have budded before the Ash trees this year, which is unusual.

It is good to see the high standard of ground works, by our contractors, Goodlife Gardeners, is continuing. The grass is looking lush and the cuttings taken away. At the top end of the Green, we are keeping the grass long under the trees and down the bank, to encourage different wildlife, of which we have an abundance.

As you will have noticed the Meadow Area has been extended and a path cut through, so you can view all the wild flowers and insects. As you walk through you can see, both red and white glover, tormentil, purple vetch, buttercups, white hemlock, daisies, I could go on. Have you noticed the Yellow Flag Iris in our Marsh Area and under the trees we've got wood sorrel, hedge parsley, wild strawberries and dog roses in the hedges. We also have several different fungi.

At the beginning of the season, the committee members spent a couple of the days clearing undergrowth, removing the remaining tree guards and ground plastic, also we did some pollarding and coppicing of the hazel trees. We also extended the fencing by the top gate, to try to prevent the bank from wearing down, plus we back filled the edging, along the path, with soil and grass seed.

At this time of the year The Green really is a lovely place to escape from the real world, with it's secluded areas it makes an ideal place for relaxation, where you can sit and listen to the birds or bring the family for a picnic.
