On Street Parking Charges Survey

Devon County Council ("DCC") propose to introduce Pay & Display charges for parking on part of Honiton High Street.

DCC says this is to improve turnover, reduce congestion and ensure parking enforcement is efficient and sustainable, with any surplus revenue from operation of pay and display helping fund other areas of transport and traffic management including bus service subsidies.

Parking on Honiton high Street is currently free for one hour, with no return for two hours between 9am and 6pm, Monday to Saturday. DCC has said that there would be no change to current arrangements outside of these times or for market days.

The proposed scheme will allow free parking for up to 30 minutes, for which you will have to get a free ticket from the Pay & Display machine.

Paying for one hour's parking, which DCC has suggested may cost £1, would be by mobile app or cash.

DCC's draft details of the scheme can be found on the <u>Honiton Town Council</u> <u>website</u>. DCC will advertise the proposals so residents can comment on the scheme, then consider the results of this consultation before any final decisions on the scheme are made.
