### Hot Pennies will be held on Tuesday 21st July 2009

The Town Crier, accompanied by the Mayor and local dignitaries will walk down the High Street, carrying the garlanded pole with a gloved hand on top, proclaiming that "no man may be arrested so long as this glove is up" reminding us all that everyone who historically came to the annual fair could do so without fear of being arrested for their debts.

The first "hot pennies" will be thrown from the balcony of the former Assembly Rooms above the Old Pannier Market and then the procession will follow the garlanded pole to a number of local pubs from which pennies will continue to be thrown to the waiting children.

The pole will be kept on show for the remainder of "fair week" at the last public house.

## Charter Day is being held this year on Saturday 25th July 2009

Charter Day is the day in the year when the town celebrates the granting of the Charter to hold a street market, making Honiton one of the foremost market towns in the area.

Following on from the week of celebrations two years ago to mark the 750<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the charter, Charter Day sees the town taken over by a mediaeval theme with traders, councillors and shopkeepers dressing up in the spirit of the event.

This year there will be entertainment all day on the forecourt of St Paul's, including the ever popular Town Crier competition – this is your opportunity to show just how well you can project your voice across the High Street!

A charity stall market will be held in Northcote Lane, giving you the opportunity to support your favourite local charity.

Other plans for the day include a charter run, a band concert and picnic in the Millennium Green, Montgomery's Art Café, a charter walk, a food fayre and a cricket match.

There will be ample places to find food and drink – from the local pubs, cafes and restaurants as well as within St Paul's church.

And at the centre of everything will be the street market – now celebrating 752 years.

Although not a Town Council event it is the annual event of the Honiton & District Agricultural Society which is the largest one-day show in the country. #### TIME TO TRY HONITON MARKET?

Honiton market is one of the oldest established markets in the area and has traded continuously since 1257.

The Town Council took over the management of the market at the beginning of the year, seeing it return to town control after over thirty years in the care of East Devon District Council.

We are pleased to see that all the traditional traders have remained with the market – but the Town Council is also now looking to reinvigorate this essential part of the town for the benefit of residents and visitors alike. New enquiries are being followed up and the Council is looking at ways to invest in some traditional market stalls for those who want to use them.

Whether you have a fledgling business or an all-consuming hobby, the market could be the place to sell your wares. Stalls are reasonably priced at £7 for a half pitch (6ft x 8ft) and £14 for a full pitch (12 ft x 8ft) and the Market Manager would be happy to talk through options with you. If you don't have your own market stall you may be able to hire one for the day from the Council - these are reasonably priced – and we will even put it up and take it down for you!

It has been agreed that this year the sports award, worth £300, will be given to the town's "unsung hero" who could be a coach, a manager or other person connected with a youth sports team. The winning "hero" will be presented with a certificate and small financial award, the remainder of the award being presented to his or her nominated team.

**Nominations for the Memorial Sports Award** should be made in writing by young people under the age of 18 and sent to the Clerk at the Town Council offices by 11th September. The nomination should give details of the "unsung hero" and why you think this person deserves to be recognised in this way.
