## WORK STARTS ON THE BEEHIVE



30 years after it was first called for, campaigners are celebrating the start of the build of the Beehive Community Complex Centre which will provide community facilities for Honiton and the surrounding area.

It was in 1983 that the then Town Mayor, Peter Blake, chaired a packed public meeting which called for a new community centre for the people of Honiton. After many ups and downs in the subsequent years, the community of Honiton is about to get the facilities it desperately needs.

Speaking at a small ceremony to mark the start of the build, Honiton's current Mayor, Councillor David Foster, said: "This is a great day for our town. It is a tribute to all those people who have worked so very hard over many years to bring this project to fruition and I believe it will play a huge role in bringing our community together both now and in the future".

Amongst those who gathered afterwards to celebrate the start of the build over tea and biscuits, were some of the campaigners who were there at the start of the project 30 years ago. Cllr Vivienne Ash who was one of those original campaigners said, "It has been a hard slog but it is fantastic to at last see the contractors on site. There is no doubt that we owe a great debt to the many people who have worked so hard to keep the project going over all these years. We are looking forward to inviting them all to the opening in December 2013"

#### Midas announced as contractor

Midas Construction have been announced by Honiton Town Council as the contractor for the Beehive Community Complex to be built in Dowell Street Honiton. Midas were selected after a rigorous procurement process.

Steering group chair Nick Cornwell, said, "We are very pleased that Midas has been selected. They are a West Country company with a good reputation and are a team we can work with. They have a good reputation of engaging with the local community during builds and also looking to support local employment".

#### What will the Beehive provide

The Beehive will deliver modern facilities for local groups and organisations, arts culture and business and include:

- Main Auditorium with seating capacity of 300.
- Large Multipurpose room with seating capacity of 100.
- Cafe/bar with seating capacity of 100.
- Meeting Room with seating capacity of 40.
- Meeting Room with seating capacity of 20.
