#### **COMMUNITY CINEMA BECOMES A REALITY**

Honiton Community Cinema launches with a feel good film - and opens its doors on Friday 23<sup>rd</sup> September at 7.30 pm in the Mackarness Hall with Ridley Scott and Kevin MacDonald's "Life in a Day". This exciting film is the result of a challenge set on July 24<sup>th</sup> 2010 asking people all around the world to upload short videos from a day in their lives. 80,000 people did just that and their work was crafted into a fantastic feel good film that shows the best of life in a day on Earth. Joyous, funny and, as Tim Robey in the Telegraph said, "with regular jolts of human weirdness" all life is here. He also gave it four stars and called it "stimulating and fresh" which is exactly what Honiton Community Cinema is setting out to be. "We want to open with something a little bit different that people may not have had the chance to see" Marianne Harman, the Chair of the project group said "and we hope that people will enjoy the sociable aspect and the chance to



chat about the film with other cinema goers." The projection is being provided by the British Federation of Film Societies with a 14' 6 screen and great sound giving a high quality cinema experience.

There will be a short film and a break for refreshments before settling down for the main feature. There's also a raffle with some fantastic prizes donated by local businesses including a lunchtime voucher for two from the Holt and a £50 shopping voucher. "We hope that people will take the chance to talk to the committee and give their ideas about what they want to see and how they want the cinema to work," Phil Sutcliffe, the cinema web manager, said.

#### Town Council plans ahead

Honiton Town Councillors have been working for the past few weeks on putting together their submission to East Devon District Council as part of the new Local Plan.

Taking account of input from residents during last year's public consultation and public meetings, the Town Council has stressed that it does not believe that Honiton is in a position to accept significant more housing development and that the main priority should be to make the town a fully sustainable community over the next twenty years. It has pointed out that Honiton's population has much more than doubled over the past 30-40 years but that the necessary infrastructure, facilities and services have not grown to match.

The two main priorities put forward by the Town Council are Employment & Economic Development and Infrastructure (including transport, roads, community facilities and the town centre). Other priorities listed are Sustainability, Open Space Retention & Provision, Education, Health & Wellbeing, Housing and Heritage.

The submission will be discussed by the EDDC Local Plan Panel on Tuesday 6 September. Copies of the Town Council's submission are available from the Town Council office or via www.honiton.gov.uk

#### HONITON ROADS

The main pedestrian crossing in the High Street is due to be refurbished and updated by Devon County Council (DCC) this autumn. The current crossing is now very outdated and obsolete in terms of replacement parts.

At the same time DCC has confirmed that the long-planned improvements to the New Street/High Street junction, including a number of new pedestrian crossings has been cancelled due to spending cuts. This is a disappointment to the Town Council that has campaigned for some time for improvements to this junction.

New Street and Church Hill will be closed to traffic from 12th to 21st September to allow essential work to the town's water mains. The contractors have spoken with the New Street businesses to assess needs and to discuss delivery vehicles, etc. They are also considering re-directing traffic to the car parks and station and will be providing an information leaflet.
