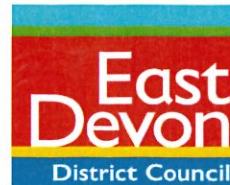

### **Consultation on varied Public Spaces Protection Orders East Devon District Council**

East Devon District Council has three existing Public Spaces Protection Orders (PSPOs) which apply across the district. These include a Dog Control PSPO, Seashores and Promenades PSPO, and Control of Anti-Social Behaviour & the Consumption of Intoxicating Substances in Exmouth and Sidmouth. We are required to review each PSPO every three years and during this process, we are proposing a number of changes to the Order.

For any extension or variation to the Order, we are required to carry out a public consultation and this includes consulting all Town and Parish Councils. All District Councillors have been advised of the consultation, and there has been a press release to inform members of the public. The details of the proposals can be found on the [East Devon District Council website](#). The website will go live on 10 October 2022.
